ANNUAL MEETING | FEBRUARY 11, 2025

OUR HISTORY

Originally founded on October 21, 1937, towards the end of the Great Depression, Houston Police Credit Union was created by Houston police officers to establish a financial institution that was owned and operated by the local police force—a financial cooperative. Their mission was to provide reasonably-priced loans and a safe place for life savings for Houston Police Department employees and their families.

The credit union had 14 charter member-owners and in the beginning, was a meager operation. When a member-owner wanted to apply for a loan, an appointed officer would take the paperwork in his squad car to the member-owner and then return the forms to the credit union, which was originally a small office in HPD's Property Room. Alex Laux was the first approved loan. The loan limit was \$25.00.

In 1966, with over 2,150 member-owners and \$2.5 million in total assets, the credit union grew large enough to warrant moving out of HPD headquarters and into a separate building. Located at 1600 Memorial Drive, it is still in use as the main branch today.

Membership, assets, and product and service offerings have continued to increase over the years. With a board of directors comprised of HPD executives and officers, the credit union has continued to remain relevant to the lives of its member-owners, even adapting the drive-up at the main branch to accommodate various official vehicles, including SWAT trucks and helicopters.

In 2024, HPCU recognized the opportunity to live its mission of providing exceptional service For Those who Serve $^{\text{TM}}$ by expanding the field of membership to include more law enforcement agencies. With this extension of services, Houston Police Credit Union will care for our members' financial future and the financial future of other officers in the same way we have always cared – a sound and secure credit union that offers competitive rates, financial benefits and premier member service. It is HPCU's goal to grow together and become stronger by including our brothers and sisters who serve.

As our membership has grown, so has the credit union. As of 2024, the credit union serves HPD staff, employees, and their families in three locations. Membership has grown to over 31,400, and assets have reached over \$927 million. From serving academy recruits with equipment loans to retirement savings and planning, our credit union has become a vital part of our member-owners' lives through every stage of their career.

Scott Simmons, Board Member, gave the invocation.

Bobby Camp began by welcoming everyone to the annual meeting. He introduced himself and the members of the Board of Directors, Supervisory Committee, Executive Staff, and Leadership Staff. Mr. Camp thanked the volunteers and the entire HPCU staff for their hard work and spoke about HPCU's values of Service, Integrity, and Teamwork.

Mr. Camp acknowledged the dedicated service of Dennis Storemski and Kenneth L. Smith, who served the institution for 43 and 37 years respectively. He requested everyone to keep both of them in their thoughts and prayers.

Mr. Camp reported that the credit union had a successful year in 2023 in spite of the volatile rate environment in the economy. He explained that with a strong executive team and dedicated staff, the membership still received excellent products and services and the credit union remains financially strong.

Furthermore, he reported that the credit union had a strong capitalization with over 15.00% which is double the NCUA required 7.00%. He also shared that the membership total at the end of 2023 was over 31,000 with a total asset of \$918 million dollars. Additionally, Member savings have contributed over \$400 million to this asset number.

Mr. Camp expressed his appreciation for the members who attended the 86th annual meeting and assured them of the credit union's top priority, which is loyalty to the members.

Steven Jolivette, Supervisory Committee Chairman, verified a quorum was present.

As everyone had been presented with the 2023 Annual Report, a motion was made to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting and accept the minutes as presented. The motion was seconded and passed.
